How to change the display options on our webpage:

If you click on the <u>blue accessibility button</u> (top right-hand corner) of our webpage this gives you options to change your display - such as making text larger, change the contrast and cursor size.

Operating System Shortcuts

Windows keyboard shortcuts

These generally works across all of the current browsers on a Windows System:

- Press Ctrl and + to increase the size
- Press Ctrl and to decrease the size
- Press Ctrl and 0 to go back to the default size

Apple Mac keyboard shortcuts

These generally work across all of the current browsers on an Apple Mac:

- Press Cmd and + to increase the size
- Press Cmd and to decrease the text size
- Press Cmd and 0 to go back to the default size

Browser Shortcuts - other methods

Safari on an Apple Mac

Go to the 'View' menu at the top of your browser window and select 'Make Text Bigger' or 'Make Text Smaller' from the drop-down menu.

<u>Opera</u>

Go to the 'View' menu at the top of your browser window and select 'Zoom' from the drop-down menu. From here you can choose an appropriate zoom percentage.

Where possible use an up-to-date browser

By using an up-to-date browser you will have access to a much wider set of accessibility options.

Options on your computer

Your personal computer will have its own set of options often found under the 'settings' or 'accessibility' menu.

Make your computer read the site

This website has been built with screen readers in mind. Menus, pictures and inputs will have the correct tags and mark up to compliment your chosen screen reader.

Control your computer with your voice

Apple Mac and Windows operating systems both provide ways to control your computer with voice recognition. The <u>BBC provide a guide to switching on voice recognition</u> across the different versions but settings are different again if you are using <u>Apple OS X Yosemite</u>. Third party voice recognition software is also available.
